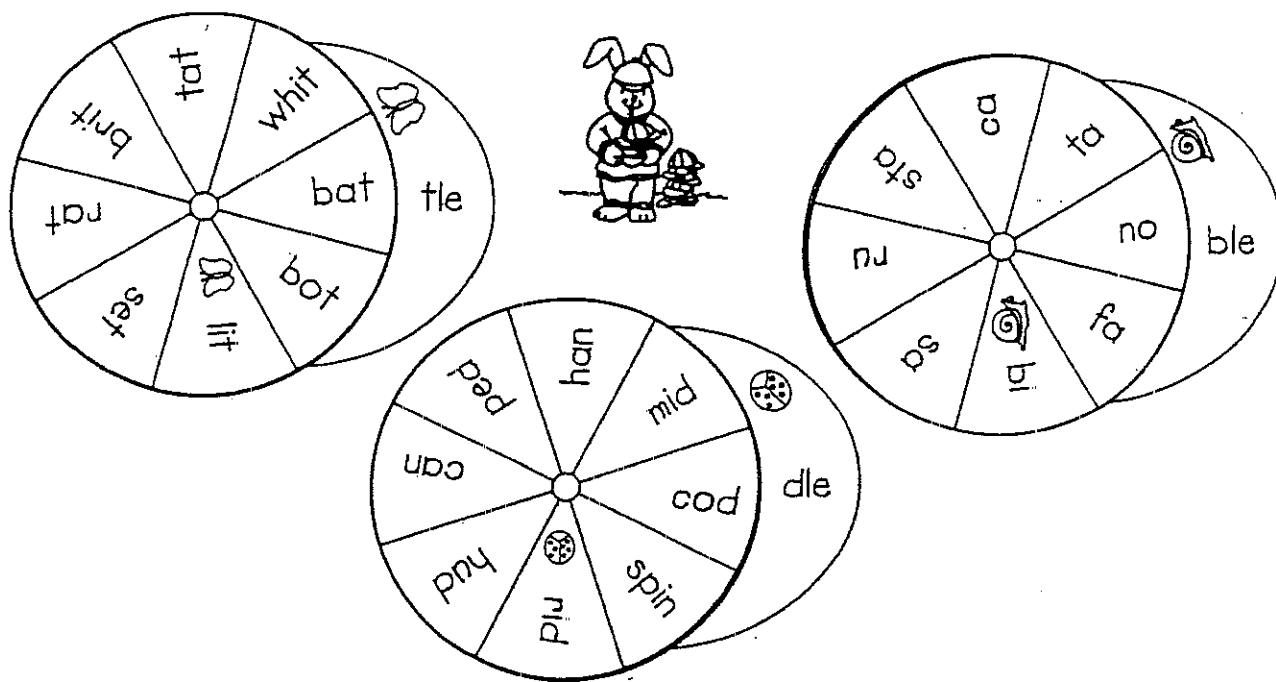


27. Little Caps

(Long and Short Vowel Syllables with Consonant-le)



To Play (1-3 players):

Each player may take one little cap or two players may work together on one, taking turns spinning the cap. Players spin the cap to line up the first syllable with the consonant-le syllable. Then they read the word. The first syllables on the cap that has the snail are long vowels. The first syllables on the caps that have a bug and a butterfly are short vowels. Optional: Players may practice two or three times reading a wheel. They may challenge each other to see who can read the words the quickest without errors.

To Make:

Duplicate all the little cap wheels. Glue on to oak tag and cut out. Punch holes in the center of the wheels. Attach the syllable wheels to the caps with a brass fastener. Use the picture on each wheel to match the wheel with its cap. Store in a clasp manila envelope. Duplicate the "To Play" directions and cut out. Glue on to the front of the envelope.
